



# Tepe Park Neighborhood Survey: 2023

October 2023 through November 2023

The Tepe Park Neighborhood Survey was conducted in 2018 and again in 2023 to examine progress toward goals included in the Tepe Park Quality of Life Plan. Both survey administrations began with a mailed survey to all residents with a valid mailing address, followed by door-to-door canvassing using neighborhood volunteers.

In 2023, a total of 131 individuals (age 18 and over) completed the survey, which resulted in an error rate of +/- 8.0% with a confidence level of 95% (i.e., this means that we can be 95% confident that results fall within 8 percentage points above and below the percentage reported). To ensure representation across the service area, respondents' census block group was tracked. All block groups in the area had representation among the survey responses. Data were also weighted by key demographic characteristics including age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, and rent/ownership status.



- > **131** participants in 2023
- > Participants reported living in their current neighborhood an average of **17 years** (range 1 month to 55 years), while residing at their current address an average of **15 years** (range 1 month to 55 years)

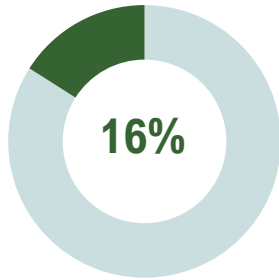


## Key Findings

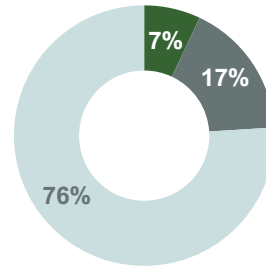
- > **About half** of residents who lived in the neighborhood for more than 5 years reported improvement in:
  - ✓ Communication about the neighborhood (**55%**)
  - ✓ Overall quality of life of residents (**53%**)
  - ✓ The level of trust and connectedness (**53%**)
  - ✓ Safety of the neighborhood (**48%**)
- > **Significant improvement from 2023 to 2018 was found for the following areas:**
  - ✓ My neighborhood is a place I want to stay
  - ✓ Activities available in the neighborhood allow people of all ages to interact
  - ✓ Feeling prepared to own a home
  - ✓ Neighborhood being safe during the day
  - ✓ Youth volunteering in the neighborhood
  - ✓ Positive activities for youth to be involved in during the school year and summer
- > **High levels of flourishing** among neighbors are present. Close Personal Relationships, Meaning and Purpose, and Character and Virtue are among the highest rated domains relative to others, and Financial and Material Stability is the lowest rated domain.

How involved are you in the Tepe Park Neighborhood Association?



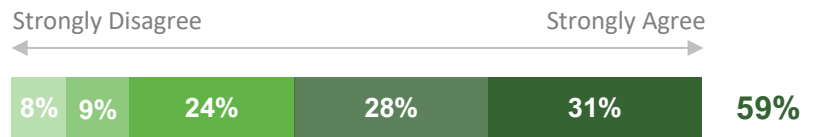

If **not at all involved** in the neighborhood association, residents were asked to explain why they are not involved. Two key themes were identified: **lack of awareness/communication** and **health factors**. Themes and examples specific to results are provided below.

## Trust, Connectedness, and Pride

> **59%** of residents agreed (agree/strongly agree) that **their neighborhood is a place they want to stay**. Further, **31%** strongly agreed.



> **41%** of residents agreed (agree/strongly agree) that **activities were available in the neighborhood to allow people of all ages to interact together**. Further, **18%** strongly agreed.

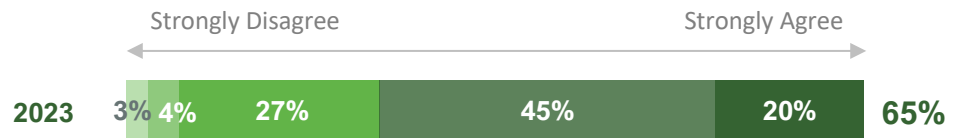

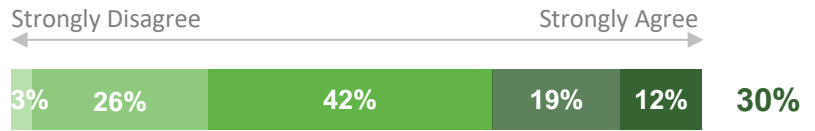

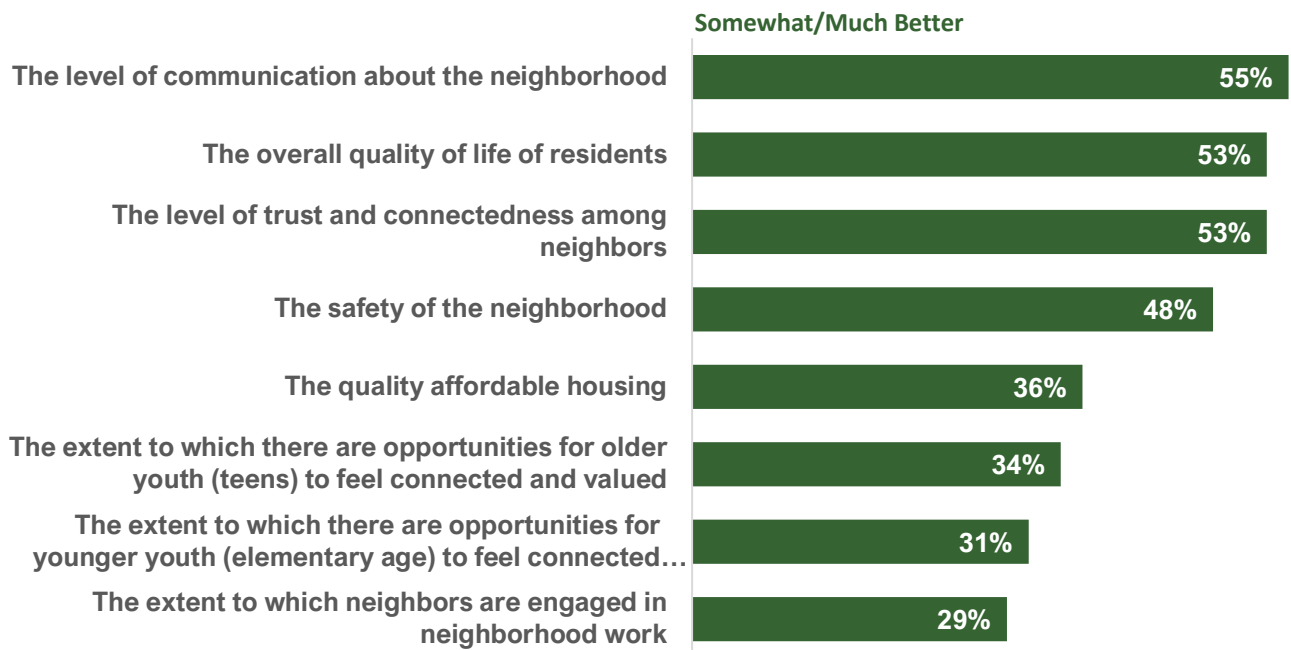

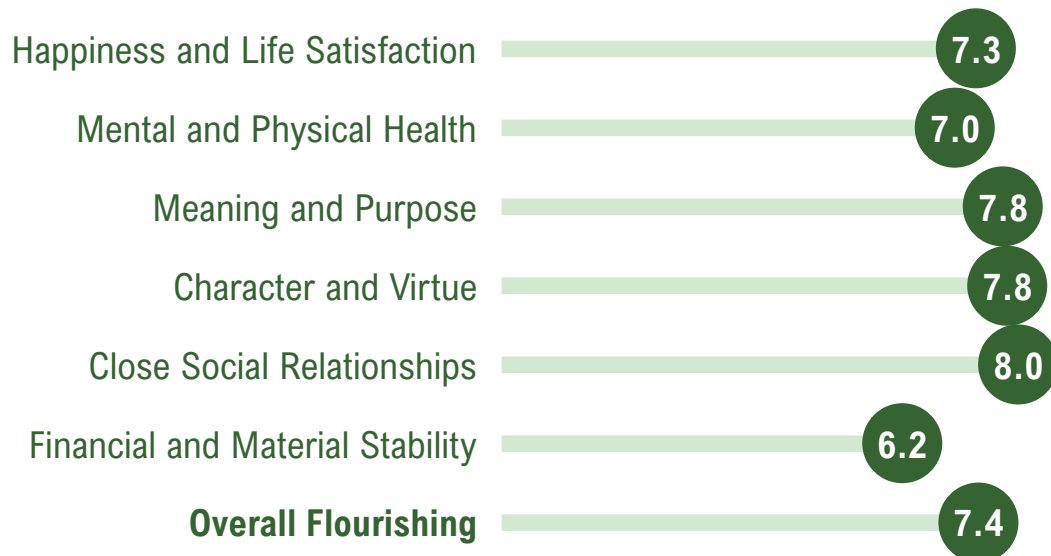

# Flourishing Index

The Tepe Park Neighborhood Survey included items from the Harvard Flourishing Index (HFI)<sup>1</sup>. The HFI is comprised of twelve items and six domains: Happiness and Life Satisfaction, Mental and Physical Health, Meaning and Purpose, Character and Virtue, Close Social Relationships, and Financial and Material Stability. Each item is rated on a scale of 0-10. The final score for each domain is the average of the two items in the domain. Additionally, the Overall Flourishing score is the average of all twelve items.

- Overall, Tepe Park residents report a **high level of flourishing** (>7). Close Personal Relationships, Meaning and Purpose, and Character and Virtue are the highest rated domains relative to others, and Financial and Material Stability is the lowest rated domain.



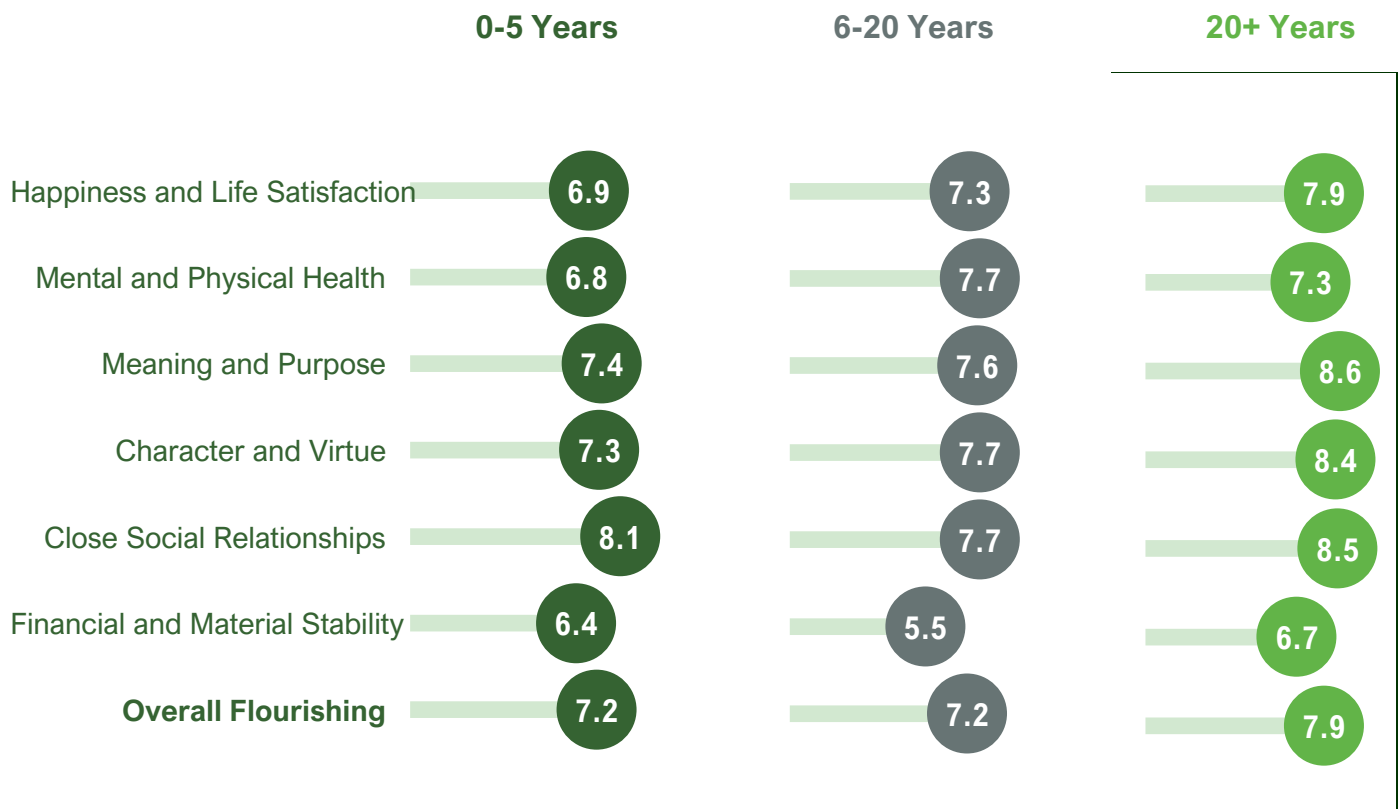

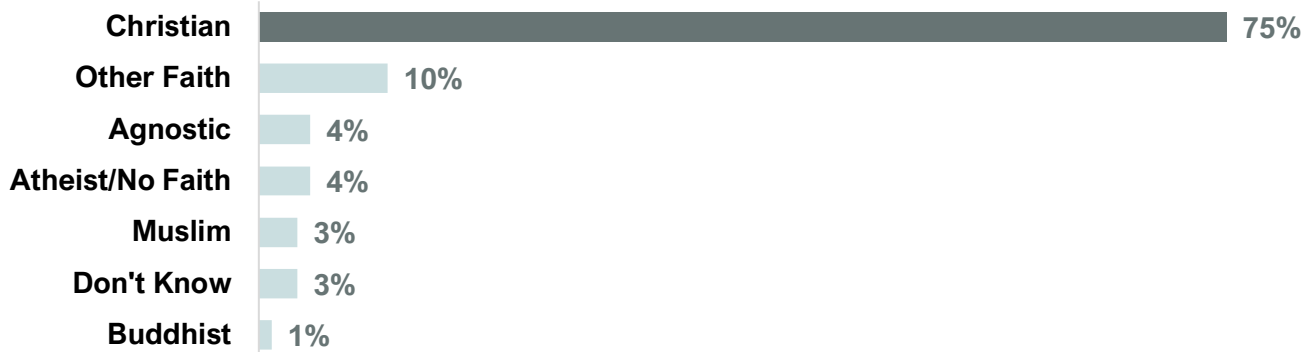
## Flourishing By Years in the Neighborhood

- Overall, Tepe Park residents who have lived in the neighborhood the longest (20+ years) have **higher levels of flourishing** compared to residents living in the neighborhood fewer years. Differences between residents living in the neighborhood **20+ Years** were more prominent for **Meaning and Purpose** and **Character and Virtue** compared to those living in the neighborhood **0-5 Years**.

# APPENDIX

## Methodology

In 2023, a total of 131 individuals (age 18 and over) completed the Tepe Park Neighborhood Survey, which resulted in an error rate of +/- 8.0% with a confidence level of 95% (i.e., this means that we can be 95% confident that results fall within 8 percentage points above and below the percentage reported). In 2018, a total of 117 individuals (age 18 and over) completed the Tepe Park Neighborhood Survey, which resulted in an error rate of +/- 8.5%. To ensure representation across the service area, respondents' census block group was tracked. All block groups in the area had representation among the survey responses, and the overall response breakdown (percent of total surveys each block group represented in returns) closely mirrored the overall distribution breakdown (percent of total surveys each block group represented in distributed surveys).

To further ensure representation, data were weighted by key demographic characteristics including age, gender, race/ethnicity, education, and rent/ownership status. As shown below for the 2023 survey, the weighted sample closely approximates distributions from the most recent version of the American Community Survey (2021). In addition to demographics described below, participants reported living in their current neighborhood an average of 17.0 years (range 1 month to 55 years), while residing at their current address an average of 14.6 years (range 1 month to 55 years). As a note, when reviewing data in this report, rounding was used to simplify data presentations and, in some cases, percentages may be greater or less than 100%.
